Outcome: You have a declarable conflict of interest

DECLARE

DECLARE your declarable conflict of interest.

If you become aware you have a declarable conflict of interest **at any time, other than during a council meeting:**

You must notify the council CEO as soon as practicable and declare your declarable conflict of interest at the next meeting of the local government or committee meeting where the matter is considered.

If you first become aware of your declarable conflict of interest in a matter **during a council meeting**. You must stop participating in a decision which relates to your interest and immediately inform the meeting.

How you declare will depend on whether you become aware of the prescribed conflict of interest during a council meeting or at another time.

ELECT

ELECT to leave the meeting voluntarily, or ask your fellow councillors to make a decision about how your declarable conflict of interest should be managed. Your fellow councillors may resolve to allow you participate in the meeting including on conditions, if it is in the public interest to do so. For example, they may resolve that you can take part in discussions, but not be allowed to vote. You or your fellow councillors must consider Interests where a reasonable person might think you could be biased. Are you going to voluntarily leave the room? **Yes**

DO NOT INFLUENCE

DO NOT attempt to INFLUENCE or discuss the matter with anyone who is a decision-maker in relation to the matter. Note: if the other councillors allow you participate in a decision, you cannot be said to have engaged in influencing your fellow councillors in that instance.

Your declaration must include the following details:

- for a gift, loan or contract – the value of the gift, loan or contract
- for an application for which a submission has been made – the matters that are the subject of the application and submission;
- the name of any entity other than the councillor, which has an interest in the matter;
- the nature of the councillor's relationship with the entity mentioned above;
- details of the councillor's, and any other entity's, interest in the matter.

You should include sufficient detail in your declaration to allow your fellow councillors to make an informed decision on how to manage your declarable conflict of interest in the public interest.
