You must notify the council CEO as soon as practicable and declare your declarable conflict of interest at the next meeting of the local government or committee meeting where the matter is considered.

If you first become aware of your declarable conflict of interest in a matter during a council meeting . You must stop participating in a decision which relates to your interest and immediately inform the meeting.

How you declare will depend on whether you become aware of the prescribed conflict of interest during a council meeting or at another time.

ELECT to leave the meeting voluntarily, or ask your fellow councillors to make a decision about how your declarable conflict of interest should be managed. Your fellow councillors may resolve to allow you participate in the meeting including on conditions, if it is in the public interest to do so. For example, they may resolve that you can take part in discussions, but not be allowed to vote.
