

Linking to Q code technology they can seamlessly transfer contact and other key information via a person's telephone and into their contacts folder.


This not only overcomes the challenges of printing and maintaining the accuracy of traditional business cards that can easily be mislaid, but also delivers a more environmentally friendly technology.

Improving **Water Quality**: Salt Water Chlorinator installed. Investigation work on discoloured water solutions underway.

Improving resilience: Installation of Flood Warning Infrastructure on Valley Creek and Marion Creek. Additional North Queensland Resilience Program funding \$4.5 m (QRA) – potential projects – Hamilton Channels (TMR) - installation of 3 sections using culverts on Hamilton Channels improving flood immunity by 45%. Betterment works (\$2.971 m) on South Urandangi Road.





Improving Infrastructure: Works for Queensland Round 5: \$1.5 million in funding to be allocated to Boulia. Installation of NBN fibre to the premises infrastructure (\$4.3m project value) to support connectivity and business growth.

Mt Isa Road safety - TMR funding approved for:

- · Increased roadside slashing activities
- Waverley Creek Give Way widening
- Section of the Mt Isa Rd widening project (two sections)
- Mt Isa Rd culvert replacement program
- Further investigation by TMR into Mt Guide narrow roadway





Staff Attraction and Retention initiatives: New Enterprise Bargaining Agreement (EBA) – negotiations with Unions completed. Council staff will now receive a percentage increase to their wage each year instead of a flat rate increase. Ist year 4%, 2nd year 3%, 3rd Year 3%. There will also be an increase to allowances for camping staff.

Why do I have to register my dog?

How much is it to register my dog?

Because it is a legal requirement under the:

" Animal Management Act 2008 "

What are the benefits of registering my dog?

If your dog finds itself lost - there is more of a chance getting it home Keep up to date with viruses throughout the dog community.

Registration fees go towards the saftey and wellbeing of said dog.

What will happen if I don't register my dog?

Where can I register my dog?

Failing to register your dog will incur a fine of 2 penalty units; total amounts to \$309.00 per dog. Boulia Shire Council office Mon-Fri between 8:30am - 5pm







Pools and Spas -Fencing Requirements



Active supervision and learning to swim are key to ensuring the safety of young children around water, especially pools.

Abiding by Pool Safety laws is mandatory in Queensland and if your pool or spa (including portable pool or spa) can hold at least 300mm of water, then the pool safety laws apply.

In Queensland, this means all regulated swimming pools are required to meet the single swimming pool barrier standard. This standard, designed to increase pool safety and simplify pool safety laws, covers such things as the height and strength of barriers, mandatory non-climbable areas, gate-latching requirements and preventing direct access from a building into a pool area and applies to new and existing pools in houses, unit complexes, hotels, motels, backpacker accommodation, caravan parks and mobile van parks.

It is the responsibility of the pool owner to not only ensure their pool is compliant with the safety standard, but to ensure their pool is registered.

Penalties, including on the spot fines, are applicable for noncompliance and failing to register. If you are selling or leasing a property with a pool, you must ensure you have a valid pool safety certificate.


